A MUSEUM OF ONE'S OWN

IT IS QUINTESSENTIALLY Canadian that the most successful our hockey players are, the more humble they are about their accomplishments. Take, for instance, the creation of a museum in the family basement. Players go to tournaments and win trophies and medals. The most successful make their way to championship games, to higher levels of competition, national and international levels of play. Yet for all the prizes they can't leave, they take them downstairs and stick them on the basement wall or along neutral hallway, far out of sight. They will, in effect, however, be testament to a player's early history, his portrait of the player as a young man. It's a little archive rich in minor hockey history and personal lore, but wonderful as it is, it is not the be-all and end-all of his life.

In putting our early trophies downstairs we say something fundamental, not about who we are. We are proud of our accomplishments in the spirit of wanting to "outbid" the awards, but not so vain as to put them in the family living room for every guest to see. Their would-be son-gods. We know that while these trophies are important, they are not the Stanley Cup or an Olympic gold medal (which might rightly claim a spot in the aforementioned living room). The basement is the right place for the lesser awards. Trophies and medals give us a sense of accomplishment, of having finished something and done something well, even, simply of having been successful in a particular time. Then, it is right to feel good about receiving an award. Slightly, though, it is also right not to feel too good because life has a way of taking you down a peg when you feel great. As any coach will say, don't let the highs get too high or the lows too low—cold advice in life as well as hockey.

The humble, not to mention superstitious, hockey player is only too aware of this. Take pride, but don't show off.

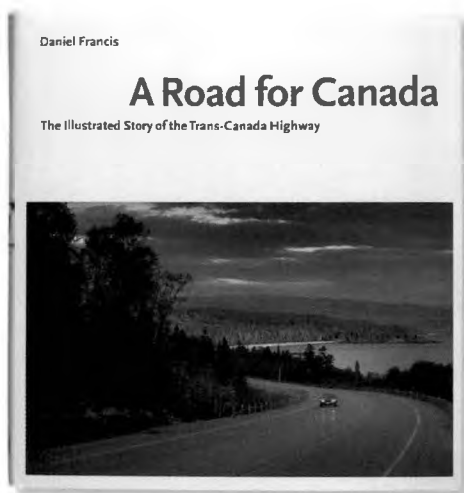

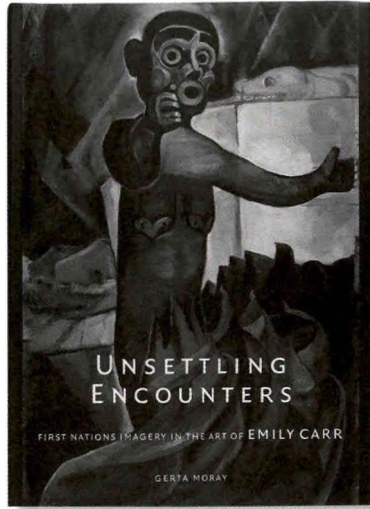
