### THE PLAN SHOULD BE an IDEAL ONE

"Uplands Farm has been acquired by J. H. Oldfield and W. H. Gardner at Winnipeg from the HBC, and is being surveyed and artificially subdivided with a view to making the property an ideal residence one and thoroughly in accordance with the situation."

In a full posthumous tribute to John Gardner that appeared in *Landscape Architecture* in 1919, his son wrote that his father always took "particular care for the details of his scheme" by working "deliberately systematically and effectively." He imagined and built a model market town, open to the public, designed to harmonize with the landscape. He spent many days on site examining the nuances of terrain, thinking through various design possibilities and, along the way, consulting with the surveyors, and a great deal more. All of this effort was intended to ingenerate the

subdivision's layout, both practically and artistically. Where should Minto Circle, a roundabout for equestrian and vehicular traffic, best be positioned? Did its planned location occupy enough level ground? If not, would adjacent land be available? What would be the effect of roads entering and leaving the community? During the days John spent on the ground at Uplands, the search for effective solutions was a constant presence.

Away from a job site, landscape architects, like all other professionals, make maps, notes made in the field, and vivid recollections, will null over a possible

design principles illustrate the degree  
which John Gardner was willing to go  
designing Uplands. "At various places in the  
intersections of roads where convenience of  
traffic seems to make it desirable, or where  
there would otherwise be no reason for it," he  
wrote, "we have left triangular  
pieces of land which may be regarded as  
reservoirs or small parks and which it is  
believed will add materially to the interest  
and beauty of the neighborhood."

The business of individual lots was accorded even greater care. As John explained to Gardner, "The boundaries of the plots as indicated on the plan will no doubt mean a great deal to the owner, but they are  
being unusually and perhaps unconsciously irregular. In some cases they have been determined by topographical conditions  
and in many cases they are run in such a way as to give the owner the maximum  
of opportunity to open up views by cutting them on his own  
land. And because the views are often more  
less diagonal to the curves of the street  
upon which the lots fronts, the side lines of the lots are frequently not parallel with the  
directions of the view. In some cases the  
boundaries of lots have been so placed as to  
prevent the owner of an adjoining lot from

The surveyed boundaries of housesites would be legal boundaries, but regulating the architecture of houses and gardens – the architecture of houses and gardens – was difficult. Taste is difficult to regulate. In the wide-ranging General Report produced for Uplands, John Olmsted offered guidelines for houses and gardens, including the following: "People will often desire to have views and trees, securing the maximum amount of light and air in the sun; an olive privacy; convenient planting; building fences, and locating the 'drivé.' The point was also made that drying laundry outside, which should be done,

should not be made visible to people as they approached the house or walked the grounds. It should be screened.

John also prepared a comprehensive list of various rules and restrictions (many with subtle twists) that were meant to protect both the park and the surrounding residential area. Many were intended to support the park-like character of the subdivision. These restrictions controlled, for instance, the cost, use, size, and height of dwellings
