Amphora, published by the Alcuin Society, appears three times a year with original articles about the reading, collecting and designing of some of Canada's best-loved books.

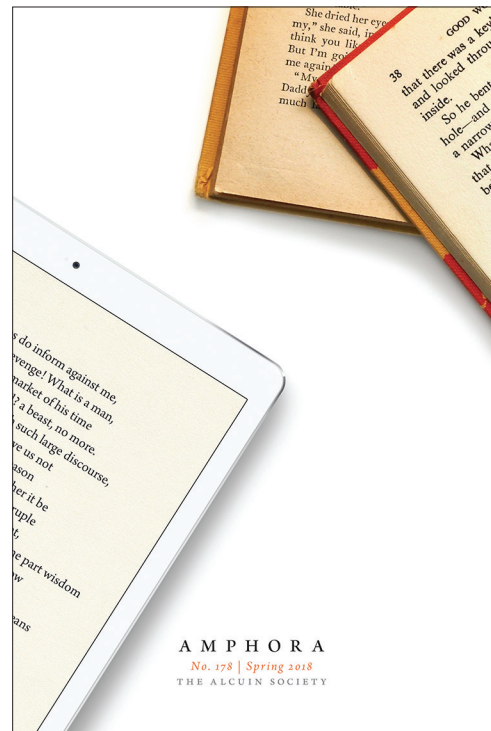
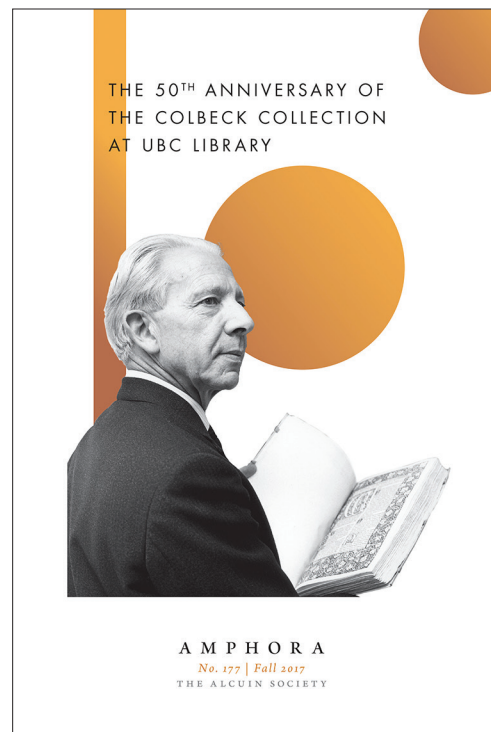
- Issue 175 visited the bookstores of early Victoria, unfolded a Leporello album and discovered the world of the *Nuremberg Chronicle*.
