The typography is meticulous, but the printing is commercial offset. The paper is acid-free and Forest Council Certified, but it is the same inglorious substance used in the trade paperback. These, however, will be the only copies of this new version of the book that are (or ever can be) sewn and cased – thus the only copies built to last and the only copies that lie open for comfortable reading. They are priced to permit the recovery of actual costs and are expected to go quickly.
