(with Cotton Nero A. ii, Part 1) Private devotional miscellany
[Ker 157, Gneuss 333]

HISTORY: Prayers for private, informal, or non-liturgical use. Includes litanies, hymns, computus texts, medical recipes, etc., most in Latin and some in OE. Eleven leaves from this book have migrated to British Library, Cotton Nero A. ii. There is a blending of Roman and Insular elements found in other A-S prayer books, such as the Book of Cerne (Cambridge, University Library, Ll.1.10). Comparable in physical dimensions, contents, apparent purpose but not in date to British Library, Royal 2. A. xx, Harley 2965, and Harley 7653. From the table on f. 9r of Nero A. ii for a 19-year lunar cycle pertinent to 1029–1047 and from the calculations for sun and moon on f. 2v of Galba A. xiv pertinent to 1034–1035, 1029, and 1040, the date can be placed in the 1030s or a little later (see Muir 1988: xv–xiv). Probably made at Winchester (note the reference to “wentana,” f. 132v/8); Bishop (1918: 387–88) notes several prayers that seem to relate to Newminster. Many texts relate to the regular monastic life. Masculine and feminine grammatical forms suggest a house of nuns and chaplains or canons. Bishop (1918: 390) and Muir (1988) place it at St. Mary’s convent, Winchester (Nunnaminster). Lapidge (1991: 70) thinks it may have been written at Winchester for a dependent nunnery, such as Shaftesbury. Badly burnt in fire of 1731. Leaves now mounted separately in frames.

CODICOLOGICAL DESCRIPTION: [iii] + 154 ff. + [iii]. There are three foliations: [*1]+ 2–155 [+ iii] (the only complete one and the one used here); a presently disordered and cancelled one, [3] + 1–61, 120, 62, 68, 63, 71, 80, 128, (skip three) 72, 64–65, 75, 66, 76–79, 67, 69–70, 73, 74, 81–119, 121–127, 129–137, + [13] (both these foliations are in pencil of 19c, and about contemporary with one another, if not by the same hand); and an earlier, intermittent one (made soon after the fire?), written in lead well into the page in different places (cf. f. 48r, “92” above l. 13; f. 65r, “108” on l. 11) that has the pages in an order completely different from that of the present bound book.

Approximate size 138 x 103 mm. Writing area of best-preserved leaves is 122 x 85 mm., with 11–18 long lines per page (the litanies and some hymns are written on carefully prepared two-column pages). Many folios are completely illegible, and water damage has darkened the edges of many leaves. There are many hands, some Insular, some Anglo-Caroline, ranging from practiced to incompetent. On f. 26v are interlineations in what appears to be an early modern hand imitating Anglo-Caroline minuscule. Muir (1988: xvi) speculates that texts were written into an already bound blank book as they came to hand.

COLLATION: Collation is impossible because the leaves have been separately mounted in paper frames. The following leaves (at least) are incorrectly presented:
