"Leofric Psalter"

[Ker 232, Gneuss 425]

**HISTORY:** Written in the third quarter of the 11c in Exeter. Lapidge (1991: 74) remarks that the manuscript may "very possibly [be] one of the two such psalters given to the Exeter chapter by Bishop Leofric in 1072." Owned by Edward Stillingfleet (1635–1699), whose collection was bought by Robert Harley in 1707 (Wright 1972: xxxiv, 316). Incorporated into the British Museum in 1753.

**CODICOLOGICAL DESCRIPTION:** [i] + 125 + [ii] leaves, foliated 1<sup>\*</sup>, 1–27, 27<sup>\*</sup>–123. Leaves measure 218 x 192 mm., with a writing grid of 190 x 145 mm. Ruled for 25 lines, with double bounding lines; prickings in the outer margins. Leaves are arranged HFHF. Leaves show some wear and are generally darkened throughout, with the gutters noticeably darkened. The book must have been without a cover for some while, since the last leaf is much dirtied and worn. Two leaves are missing after f. 48, originally containing Ps. 70.11 *Dicentes*–71.38 *faciet*. Another two leaves containing lections are missing after f. 120. Stitching appears on ff. 18, 27\*, 30, 50, 70, 83, 113. Modern repairs have been made to ff. 27\*, 30, 33, 36, 51, 63, 68, 84. Holes appear on ff. 19, 32, 56, 59, 96. The calendar employs red, green, and blue ink, in addition to brown. The display line to Ps. 1 is written in red and black ink. Initials throughout are in blue, green, and (oxidized) red ink. At the beginning of Ps. 51 is a large blank space after the title; to the left is an incomplete drawing in lead showing an oval containing a floral design. A small face in red ink appears in the upper margin of f. 20r. F. 54r has a figure in red drawn in the top margin, with a crowned human head and a serpentine body. Major psalm divisions occur at ff. 8r, 37v, 68r, and 77v. Psalm titles are in red. Psalms are preceded by versicles, many of which are neumed. Neumed responses are added in the margins. Responses to the lections are written in a smaller hand and are neumed.
