Aldhelm, "De laude virginitatis"
[Ker 238, Gneuss —]

HISTORY: Dated to the 12c. A note (12/13c) on f. 1v associates the codex with the Cistercian abbey of New Minster (near Morpeth): "Lib(er) s(an)c(t)e marie noui monast(er)y". The manuscript was once in the collection of Lord William Howard (1563–1640) (Wright 1972: 199). Acquired by Robert Harley (1661–1724) from John Warburton (1682–1759) and recorded in the diary of Humfrey Wanley (1672–1726) for 16 July 1720 (Wright and Wright 1966: 59).

CODICOLOGICAL DESCRIPTION: [ii] + 97 + [i] leaves, foliated 1–97. Leaves measure 223 x 150 mm., with a writing grid of 166 x 87 mm. Ruled in brown ink for twenty-two lines. Pricking in outer margins; single bounding lines. Initials are nearly all in green or red ink. The large initials heading the prologue (f. 3r) and the beginning of the text proper (f. 11r) are in green and red ink, as are the initials on f. 30v and 66r. The initial on f. 13r is in blue ink. Chapter numbers are in red ink. The bottom margin of f. 58 has been trimmed. Holes (some natural, others occurring probably during the preparation of the vellum) are found at ff. 25, 26, 42, 44 (once sewn), 45, 49, 50, 53 (once sewn), 57 (once sewn), 62 (once sewn prior to text being written), 70, 78, 89, and 90. Two paper flyleaves at the beginning and end of the codex, with the date "16 July 1720" on the recto of the first leaf.

COLLATION: I⁸⁺² (ff. 1–10) (ff. 1–2 comprise a bifolium added to the beginning of the quire), II⁸ (ff. 11–18), III⁸ (ff. 19–26), IV⁸ (ff. 27–34), V⁸ (ff. 35–42), VI⁸ (ff. 43–50), VII⁸ (ff. 51–58), VIII⁸ (ff. 59–66), IX⁸ (ff. 67–74), X⁸ (ff. 75–82), XI⁸⁺¹ (ff. 83–91), XII⁸ (ff. 92–97).

- ff. 3r-7r Aldhelm, "Epistola 3": *Incipit epistola aldelmi ep(iscop)i.* | 'D(OMI)NO UENERA| BILI preconio efferen|do et s(an)c(t)orum meritis | magnopere honorando | hechfrido aldelmvs exiguu(s) | in d(omi)no eternam salutem.... Explicit ep(isco)la aldelmi episcopi' (PL 89: 92-95) [scattered interlinear glosses and marginal scholia].
- ff. 7r-10r Table of contents for chaps. 1-60 of "De laude virginitatis": *Incipiunt capitula libri sequentis | de laudibus S(an)c(t)arum Virginum.*
- ff. 11r-96r "De laude virginitatis" (prose version): 'REUERENTIS-SI| mis chr(ist)i uirginibvs omniq(ue) | deuote germanitatis affectu | uenerandis' (PL 89: 103-62; Ehwald 1919). Chap. 30 begins 'AMOS PRIMVS NIJTRIE | famosus accola.... celorum orbibus conspexit'; The opening ('Amos ... refragabatur') is actually the beginning of chap. 37 (PL col. 158; see Ehwald 1919: 268, note s). Contains six OE glosses contemporary with the Latin text: *tiliaq : lind* (f. 13v), *uiminis : uirge . oser* (f. 14r), *glumula : scale* (f. 30r), *naptarum : 7 tūdar* (f. 33r), *occa : felg* (f. 43v), *antes : tanas* (f. 65v) (ed. Napier 1900: no. 10).
- f. 96r Verse in the same hand as main text: 'Tres digit[i] scribunt. totum corpusq(ue) laborat. | Scribere qui nescit. nullum putet esse laborem. | Dum digit[i] scribunt uix cet(er)a memb(ra) quiescunt' [see also 288].
- ff. 96v-97r *Alexander p(a)p(a) iii r(ogero) eboracensi archiep(isco)po.* 'Fraternitatem tuam scire uolum(us) firmit(er) | 7 ten(e-

r>e' [*tuam* written after *firmiter*, but signaled to be moved to after *Fraternitatem*].
