Submitting to the BCLA Browser

By going with <u>Open Journal Systems</u>, BCLA is able to streamline the publishing operation of a volunteer run publication.

Authors simply need to <u>register</u> with the journal website in order to submit items for publication in the

Browser. Once logged in, authors complete a fivestep submission process. Detailed <u>instructions for</u> <u>authors</u> are available to guide you through the system.

Using the <u>word template</u> created by our graphic designer helps alleviate the significant time required by the editors to layout and copyedit numerous submissions simultaneously in advance of the publication date.

Deadlines for submissions

- January 10th for February 1 publication.
- March 10th for April 1 publication date.
- June 10th for July 1 publication date [Conference Reports Edition].
- October 10th for November 1 publication date.

Issue no. 3 will be published on July 1 and will regularly feature reports from the annual conference. If you are attending, please consider sending in a summary of your experience at the conference and/or a summary of a session that you found most interesting and rewarding.
