# **Overview**

2010 has been a busy and successful year for the CE Committee. We have organized five new workshops and gained five new members!

We are very happy to welcome the new members who joined the committee in 2010 and early 2011: Kathy Anderson (IslandLink), May Chan (BPL), Fatima Ferreira (GVPL), Ben Harrison (COTR), and Susan Laidlaw (PLSB). We'd also like to thank the two members who stepped down from the committee for their contributions and support: Carol Elder (Langara) and Rob Jacobsen (Kwantlen).

The committee continued to work on the same overall goals as last year - to recruit new members, to offer excellent continuing education and preconference sessions, and to build relationships with libraries in other parts of BC in order to offer workshops outside of the lower mainland.

The committee attempted to provide two workshops outside of the lower mainland – a teaching and training workshop in Houston and a health information workshop in Nanaimo. Although the committee members, our regional contacts, and the workshop presenters worked hard to organize and promote the sessions, we had to cancel both due to low registration. While the cancellations were unfortunate, we realized we needed to rethink our strategy in regards to reaching out to other areas of the province. With the help of our PLSB member Susan Laidlaw, we were able to connect with the directors of the regional library Federations to discuss working together when exploring opportunities for regional workshops. Workshops developed will be open to all who work in the BC library community.

# **New Developments**

As of early 2011, the committee has formalized a liaison and communication plan with the BC Library Federations to support continuing education throughout the province. Kathy Anderson, Director of the IslandLink Federation, is now a member of the CE committee and is our liaison with the Federations. We are already developing ideas for workshops that can be offered province-wide via the new public library Elluminate webinar software license.
