### **Rebuilding of Slave Lake Library Project**

In May, the Geoffrey R. Weller Library undertook a fundraising endeavour in support of the Rebuilding of Slave Lake Library Project. The campus community was asked for book donations and the response from the UNBC and Prince George communities was tremendous — we were literally flooded in books. The books were sorted: appropriate books went to Slave Lake while the others were placed in a book sale and proceeds donated to the Slave Lake Library.

The results were outstanding: 44 boxes sent to Slave Lake, \$353.81 was collected and donated, and 11 boxes sent to the Prince George Hospice Society. The library owes a huge debt of gratitude to a UNBC employee, Guy Hewton, who undertook a road trip to deliver the books.
