We are excited to let members know this session will be the last hurrah for LTAIG Mentoring: In 2012, BCLA will be launching an association-wide mentorship initiative, inclusive of all members. LTAIG Mentoring has worked closely with BCLA's Mentorship Working Group, and is anticipating the benefits of have one larger program.
