

President's AGM Report: 2011-2012

The last year has been a very challenging year for BCLA. Immediately after last year's conference Errin Morrison and I began to look for a site for the 2012 conference with the Conference Working Group Facilities Sub-Committee. After looking at a variety of venues, and types of contracts, we decided on the Richmond Sheraton for both the 2012 and 2013 conferences. We decided to have a much tighter conference without the pre-conference and without a post conference meeting of the board at the hotel to increase cost efficiency. I'd like to thank the members of the Conference Working Group Facilities Sub-Committee: Michael Burris, Stephen Carr, Mari Martin, Todd Rowlatt and Errin Morrison. Errin and I also made the decision to hire Dragonfly Consulting to manage this year's BCLA Conference.

At this point I like to thank Errin Morrison for her time as BCLA's Executive Director. Working with Errin, as vicepresident and later as president, was always a pleasure. I always appreciated Errin's dedication, professionalism, ideas, capacity for work and her good humour. Please join me in publically thanking Errin for her many contributions to BCLA.

I formed an internal BCLA Human Resources Committee to search for a new executive director in September 2011. The Committee looked at best practices, job descriptions, finances and the needs of the Association and the Board. Throughout its work the HR Committee endeavoured to be as transparent as possible about its process. I'd like to thank the BCLA HR Committee's members: Debbie Schachter, June Stockdale, Deb Thomas and Errin Morrison for contributing a significant amount of time to this work.

A number of months ago I struck a working group to look at the results of last year's BCLA Membership Survey, and make recommendations to improve the benefits for BCLA members. This working group has

finished its work and has produced a document which will be used when going forward with membership initiatives. I'd like to thank Survey Working Group members Jamie Anderson and Chris Middlemass for their work on this project.

I'm pleased to say the Mentorship Working Group has been working hard to create a mentorship programme which will benefit future, and current, library technicians and librarians. The Communications Committee, established last vear, has met several times to discuss a wide variety of issues revolving around BCLA'S communications, both internally and externally. We have broken the committee into two sub-committees, one to look at communication policies with BCLA members, sections, committees and interest groups, and with external organisations. The other sub-committee is looking at BCLA's communication mechanisms such at The Browser and our website and list serves. All of these findings will be used to inform our new BCLA webpage, on which work has already begun. I'd like to thank the Communication Committee's members for their ongoing work and commitment to this project: Greg Currie, Vicki Donoghue, Leanna Jantzi, Anne Olsen, June Stockdale, Errin Morrison, Annette DeFaveri and Allie Douglas. I anticipate that the work of these sub-committes will be finished by the end of this June.



Earlier this year BCLA Executive Director Annette DeFaveri and I initiated an Interim Strategic Plan. There have been a number of strategic planning efforts on behalf of the Association in the past, but many objectives remain outstanding, and recent financial and staffing changes for BCLA have absorbed much of the Board's efforts. However, we decided it was critical to set a direction for the association in order to successfully fundraise. It was decided this exercise would be cost neutral due to BCLA's current budgetary situation (as previously highlighted by our Treasurer in her report). At an extraordinary meeting of the Board we focused on financial sustainability and responsibility, professional development including education and training, advocacy and communications, as well as next steps. It is important to stress that this in an interim strategic plan. Its purpose is the give the Board and the executive director a rough direction in which to steer the Association and start to fundraise. The results of this meeting will have to be refined and expanded at future strategic planning meetings in order to develop a more in-depth long-term strategic plan.
