Conference survey results

The formal conference assessments are now in and what a pleasure it is to read them. Thank you to all who took the time to complete the online survey and for putting much thought and consideration in to your responses.

Of the people who completed the survey 51.0 percent rated the sessions as above average and 31.4 percent rated the sessions as excellent.

Comments about the overall conference include:

- "...one of the best conferences...because of the interactivity of the sessions and the variety of sessions available."
- "...engaging, informative and left me wanting to hear more."
- "... great opportunities to network and to learn more about the library world."

What can we do to improve?

Most of the feedback we received was positive and thoughtful. But from a planning perspective I was most anxious to see the answers to the question "What can we do to improve the conference?" This question was an opportunity for members to make suggestions for future conferences and for the Conference Planning Committee to benefit from the creativity and insight of BCLA members. It is often easy to recognize things that need to be improved, but making suggestions on how to improve is the most welcome and useful feedback we could hope for.

One participant noted a lack of sessions geared specifically for new librarians and new members of the library community. The suggestion she made was to consider a social event that focused on new library workers that would help introduce them to the diverse work environments throughout the province.

Several respondents commented on the choice of events, timetable, and organization on Saturday.

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the structure of Saturday's sessions included moving the AGMs to the end of the day and having a keynote speaker first thing in the morning; shorten the Saturday lunch break and open it to all delegates thus creating a better networking opportunity; carry the enthusiasm from the Friday afternoon (eBook) session over to an organized dinner for all attendees.

These, as well as all other suggestions will be part of the Conference Planning Committee debriefing meeting.

- "... the new ideas that keep us all improving."
- "... engaging with colleagues and being reenergized."
- "... the focus on working together that linked the sessions."
- "... the opportunity to be challenged by current thinking."
- "...the high quality of the sessions and the mix of session topics."

Preparing for the next conference means that we will keep all of the comments, both positive and constructive, in mind as we endeavor to provide an even more successful conference experience for delegates in 2013.
