There are a number of role changes at The School of Library, Archival and Information Studies, the iSchool at The University of British Columbia.

Helene Høyrup Ph.D., of the Royal School of Library and Information Science in Denmark, joins the School this month as the inaugural Dodson Visiting Professor. She is in the position February to April 2013, and will be teaching two classes as well as making public presentations on her research. Of interest to the BCLA community will be her lunchtime colloquium talk on Wednesday, March 20: "Literature between Bookspace and New Literacy Space: Towards a Connective Ethnography of Children's Literature and Digital Media." This free talk will be given in the Dodson Room, on the third floor of the Irving K. Barber Learning Centre, from 12 noon to 1 p.m. Registration not required.

She will also speak at a symposium on the late children's author Maurice Sendak, organized by the students in the Master of Arts in Children's Literature program. That event will be held Friday, March 1st, 3:30-6:30 pm, also in the Dodson Room. Dr. Høyrup will address "Maurice Sendak's Modernism for Children: A Celebration of the Signifier?" Dr. Heather O'Brien, assistant professor, returns to the School after a year's leave of absence, and is teaching two courses this term, Understanding Information Users in Diverse Environments, and Collection Management. Dr. Rafa Absar, who taught Dr. O'Brien courses during her absence in 2012, remains with the iSchool as a Postdoctoral Researcher, working on research in user behaviour with Dr. O'Brien. She joins Dr. Michael Huggett, who is a postdoctoral researcher working with Dr. Edie Rasmussen.

Heather Shand is serving as the school's Acting Student Services Coordinator, while a search is in process to replace Michelle Mallette who has taken a new position as Director of Student Academic Services with the Faculty of Science.
