## The Summer Conference Season

It seems that the iSchool@UBC has been all over BC the past few months. Here are just a few highlights from the May and June conference season:

May: Students in the Master of Arts in Children's Literature (MACL) program hosted <u>"I Will Be Myself":</u> <u>Identity in Children's Literature, Media and Culture</u> (May 3). The one-day conference at UBC's Irving K. Barber Learning Centre showcased graduate student research surrounding identity in various elements of children's and young adult literature, media and culture. The day consisted of 45 presentations, and approximately 75 delegates attended from across Canada, the US, and as far away as Iran!

The iSchool was a fixture at this year's <u>Canadian</u> <u>Library Association Conference</u> in Victoria (May 28 – 31). iSchool faculty member Judith Saltman presented with student Rachel Balko and alumnus Justin Unrau on their book, *The Canada-IFLA Adventure: A Journey of Discovery*. The book was coauthored with three other grads who could not attend the session: Myron Groover, Jamie McArthy, and Dan Gillean.

Adjunct faculty members Guy Robertson and Alyssa Green delivered presentations on "Emergency Preparedness and Disaster Planning for Libraries" and "Community Economic Development and the Role of the Library," respectively.

Three students presented papers and posters that were very well-received. MLIS student Anna Ferri presented "<u>Healthy Collaborations: Bringing Together</u> <u>Hospital Libraries and Public Libraries to Serve</u> <u>Children in Hospital Care</u>." MLIS student Matthew Murray presented a poster on zines entitled "<u>Whatcha Mean, What's a Zine? - Introducing Zines</u> <u>into Your Library Collection</u>." Recent MLIS grad Danielle Wing presented on the panel, "Student Views: Research from Canada's LIS Programs."

June: The <u>Special Libraries Conference</u> made a trip to Vancouver this year (June 8-10) and the iSchool was well-represented in the program and at the Trade Show. In addition to presentations from numerous alumni and community partners, Dr. Heather O'Brien presented as part of a panel on "<u>Engaging Users with</u> <u>Technology</u>," and Professor Judith Saltman spoke as part of the "<u>Children's Literature Panel</u>." PhD candidate Jessica Bushey took part in the "<u>Speed</u> <u>Geek</u>" event.

## At the recent Association of Canadian Archivists

(ACA) Conference in Victoria (June 26 – 28), Dr. Luciana Duranti, Chair of the MAS program, was honoured as an "ACA Fellow." According to the ACA, this award is the highest recognition the association can bestow on its members. "Fellows are celebrated and acknowledged for their longstanding service to the Association and the Canadian archival community," as stated on the <u>ACA website</u>.

In addition to innumerable alumni presenting at the conference, our students and recent grads were the talk of the town. Recent grad Alexandra Wieland took part in "<u>New Voices, New Ideas: The Student Session</u>," and spoke about "Exploring the Archival Bond in Personal Archives."
