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# RELATIONAL APPROACH

- Infants explore their environment and the caregiver responds
- Infants expect behaviours from others
- △ Infants create routines with caregivers



# LITERATURE REVIEW

## CAREGIVER RESPONSIVENESS AND SOCIAL BIDS



### Still Face Experiments

- Parents fake non-responsiveness
- Infants become upset as they expect response from social bid

# MY STUDY

## HYPOTHESIS

Infants will increase amount/diversity of social bids when they are ignored

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Infants will have greater diversity of social bids longitudinally

## QUALITATIVE

Allow for examination of differences and similar pathways

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Difficult to capture phenomena in lab settings

# Findings

Between “DL” and “AM”

**01** Both re-attempted when ignored

**02** Both increase of amount and diversity of social bid

**03** Caregiver non-responsiveness is part of development
