- Infants expect behaviours from others
- **△** Infants create routines with caregivers

Still Face Experiments

- Parents fake non-responsiveness
- Infants become upset as they expect response from social bid

MY STUDY

HYPOTHESIS

Infants will increase amount/diversity of social bids when they are ignored

Infants will have greater diversity of social bids longitudinally

QUALITATIVE

Allow for examination of differences and similar pathways

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Difficult to capture phenomena in lab settings

Findings

Between "DL" and "AM"

01 Both re-attempted when ignored

02 Both increase of amount and diversity of social bid

O3 Caregiver non-responsiveness is part of development
