Laiwan states: the performance at Spatial Poetics X will be an opportunity to return to celebrate and push my first venture into performance at the 2002 Spatial Poetics when I premiered my video/music performance whale: contrary to shaping a permanence. Further investigation into the challenges I faced in that work, my new performance for 2011 will rigorously take the themes and ideas from whale to proceed to additionally explore movement and bodily being into a radical somatic poetics.

Rooted in an intellectual and conceptual visual art lineage, my foray into improvisational performance is aimed to explode the binary limits of artificial and bodily/emotional intelligence as an Asian woman, as an Asian lesbian, and the constructs which shape stereotypes within those containers. With this work, I hope to invigorate and inspire participants and audiences at the 2011 Spatial poetics with a brashly resonant experience of somatic poetics while further developing and sharing my collaborative and improvisational abilities with flair.
