## NOTHING IS FREE

Nothing is Free is an exploration of the culturally specific performed self. Lead opera singer Mori plays out ideas of Japanese and Canadian national stereotypes situated in both the historical romantic and the modern glamorous. In doing so, he comes face to face with his personal construction of identity. The artist examines what it means to be from Vancouver by way of Japanese Diaspora, confronting his own romanticized stereotyped ideals of ethnic origin. Mori engages with these ideas by performing as two crisscrossing characters in a Kabuki-inspired play, and is accompanied by flautist Mark Macgregor and percussion performed by Iman Habibi. Providing an unconventional musical score, collaborators punctuate theatrical moments of clarity with confusion and vice versa. The musicians play a fusion of experimental music with classical Japanese progressions that complement Mori's performance, highlighting the tenuous boundaries that characterize performed identities.
